Autumn Term 1



What is the countryside like? How is the countryside different from the town? What is the seaside like? Why do people go to the seaside?

Prior Knowledge:

Overview: Barnaby Bear Investigates the UK. Children will begin to understand that their area is part of a gradually widening space - town, region, country, UK, Europe, the world, space - is an enormous and important step for young children to take. Using Barnaby Bear to travel further afield gives pupils a shared experience centred on an identifiable character, through which they can start to broaden their knowledge.

Measuring Weather

A **weather vane** is an instrument used to show the direction the **wind** is blowing from.

A **rain gauge** is a simple measurement tool that tells you how much **rain** has fallen over a period of time.

Wind speed can be measured using an anemometer.
