



- Barriers




Map of Mablethorpe

Town: populated areas with fixed boundaries and a local government.

Village: a small settlement usually found in a rural setting.

Aerial, building, bus lanes, cathedral, chain store, chicanes, community, crossroads, department store, estate agents, industry, land use, market, museum, newsagent, one way street, parking restrictions, pedestrian crossing, pedestrianised street, population, public buildings, residential, recreation, roundabouts, services, shopping centre, speed bumps, speed limits, superstore, timed closures, traffic control measures.

Fieldwork tools:

1. Paper and pencil - to record what you find out.
2. Questionnaires- Ask others to gain their knowledge of places and spaces.
3. Tape Measure: To measure distance, areas and spaces.
4. Photographs: To record what you have seen.
