Intent: Art and design helps me to show how I see the world Years 3 and 4 Knowledge Organiser Mablethorpe Primary Academy Term 5

Prior Knowledge: Throughout your journey in school, you have explored and developed a variety of new skills which we build upon each year. In Years 3 and 4, we have previously explored various artistic materials including ready mix, watercolour paint, wax crayons, pencils and chalk. Children will have explored key areas of the art framework including painting, printing, pattern and sculpture.

Overview: Children will be creating cloth and thread scenes linked to Anglo Saxons or fairy tales. They will combine media such as paint, mark making and thread to create these scenes. Children will explore the artwork of different artists and create visual notebooks to show their responses linked to the artwork seen. They will experiment with different marks using a variety of mark making materials and experiment with colour, texture, tone and movement.
