



Themes Key Question: Why does Easter matter to Christians?

Salvation: Understanding Christianity Unit

Prior Knowledge: In Year 1, children will have learned about the Christian belief of the nature of God and will have explored the creation story. They will have begun to have some understanding of the fall and that Christians believe that God loves humanity. In this unit, children will learn about the importance of Easter to Christians and further develop their understanding of the symbolism of the cross to Christians: that being Jesus' sacrifice.
