Dear Parent/Carer,

This school year we have been implementing the PSHE (Personal, Social and Health Education) Programme across our academy called Jigsaw, the mindful approach to PSHE.

The lessons since September, have built children's emotional literacy, self-esteem and knowledge of who they are and how they relate to each other and the world in a positive and healthy way. We are sure you will have heard about the Jigsaw Friends and Calm Me time.

The Summer Term units are about Relationships (unit 1) and Changing Me (unit 2).

Changing Me Puzzle Year 3

- Children will learn about what babies need to grow and develop.
- They will be taught that it is usually the female who carries the babies in various animals, including humans.
- Pupils look at the outside body changes in puberty and they learn that it is a process which gets the body ready for making babies in adulthood.
- Children learn that female bodies release monthly eggs, which unfertilised are released as a period.

We hope you will be in agreement with us that this work is vitally important for children, that it needs to be done age-appropriately and the Jigsaw Programme gives us a secure framework in which to do this.

However, we do as always want to work in partnership with parents and carers, and also wish to inform you of your legal right to withdraw your children from some aspects of this work. The government has made Relationships Education and Health Education statutory for all primary schools from September 2020. However, the aspects of PSHE which teaches sex education are optional. It is up to you as parents to decide whether you wish for your child to take part in the lessons in Term 6 from Changing Me. These are:

- Week 1- 'How Babies Grow'
- Week 2 - 'Babies'
- Week 3 - 'Outside Body Changes'
- Week 4 - 'Inside Body Changes'

We hope you, like us, will see the materials in Jigsaw as educationally sound and beneficial to our children in terms of safe-guarding and keeping them informed.
