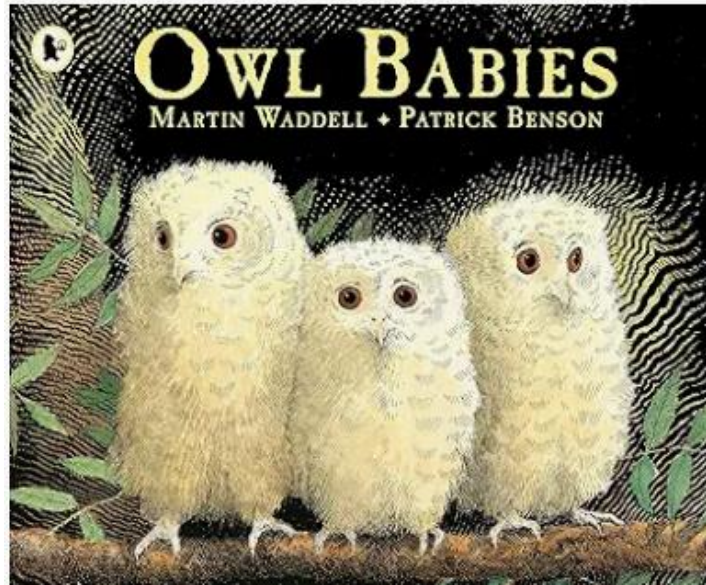

New Grammar and meanings for this unit of work

Noun	A noun is a person, place, object e.g. stars, trees, owls are all nouns.
Adjective	An adjective describes a noun e.g. huge, brown, feathery .
Verb	A verb is a doing, a happening or a state of being e.g. running, is, became .
Finger spaces	You leave a space between each word you write.
Full stop	At the end of a sentence you need a full stop. This sits on the line.
Capital letter	All sentences must start with a capital letter
