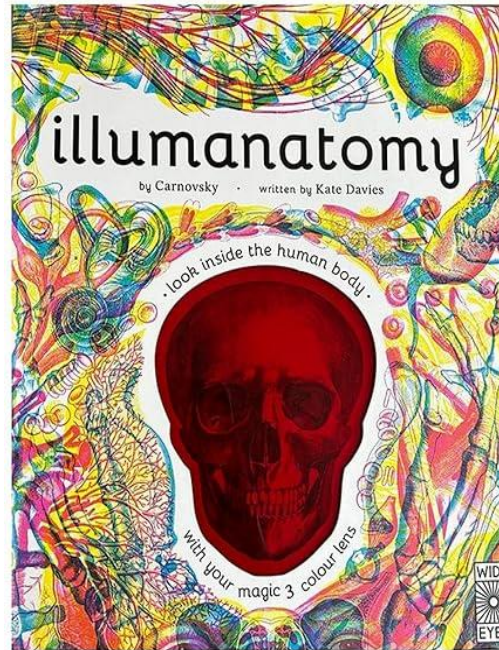

New Grammar and meanings for this unit of work

relative clause	A relative clause can be used to give additional information about a noun. They are introduced by a relative pronoun like 'that', 'which', 'who', 'where,' 'why', 'whose'
semi-colons	A semicolon is used, in a single sentence, to link two independent clauses that are closely related.
parenthesis	Parenthesis is a word, phrase, or clause inserted into a sentence as an explanation using brackets commas, or dashes.
dashes	The main use of a dash in English is to separate or connect two independent clauses.
