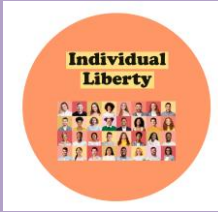




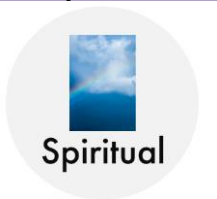
How does our Careers and Aspirations curriculum support British Values, SMSC and our whole school MPA values?
