PSHE	<p>Spiritual education in PSHE inspires children to learn more about their minds and bodies. Pupils are taught what it means to be a UK citizen.</p> <p>PSHE allows pupils to reflect on self and develop their personal identity. Pupils will learn how our identities are complex and can change over time.</p> <p>Pupils also learn to understand a healthy lifestyle and decision making about their health.</p>	<p>Moral education in PSHE provides opportunities for pupils to discuss what is right and wrong, fair and unfair in different situations. Pupils will learn about their rights in terms of political, legal and human rights and how it affects them as individuals and the communities they live in.</p> <p>PSHE provides time for children to consider their own ideas, opinions, assumptions, beliefs and values and those of others.</p> <p>PSHE lessons allow children to investigate moral and ethical issues and develop skills of critical thinking, enquiry and decision making as well as managing risk.</p>	<p>Social education in PSHE enables pupils to develop their social skills as they work in pairs, small groups and whole class sessions. It helps them consider how democracy, justice, tolerance, respect, integrity and freedom are valued by people with different beliefs, backgrounds and traditions in a changing society.</p> <p>It develops children's understanding of the importance of positive and supportive friendships as well as ways of dealing with conflicts. Pupils will discuss how media informs and influences the public. It also allows pupils to consider how the media affects them.</p>	<p>Cultural education in PSHE helps children to explore diverse national, regional, ethnic and religious cultures and groups in the UK and the connections between them.</p> <p>PSHE lessons enable pupils to appreciate cultural influences, to understand, accept, respect and celebrate diversity.</p> <p>Children are given time to develop their understanding of service to community and how they fit into their own community.</p> <p>PSHE provides opportunities for pupils to critically evaluate different ideas and views.</p>

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
