New Grammar and meanings for this unit of work

prepositions	A preposition is a word that tells you where or when something is in relation to something else. Examples of prepositions include words like after, before, on, under, with.
adjectives	Describes a noun.
nouns	A person, place, object, thing.
verbs	An action/ doing word
determiners	A determiner is a word that comes before a noun or noun phrase to clarify if the noun is specific or general.
expanded noun phrases	Expanded noun phrases tell you more about the noun for example, the tall girl
clauses	A group of words that includes a subject and a verb to form a simple sentence or only part of a sentence
